## ASSESSING CRITICAL THINKING

While circulating around the classroom and observing group discussions, pose the following questions to assess students' critical-thinking abilities. Keep notes on individual students and use during conferences to provide feedback and to assess at the end of the project.

Examples of Questions	Notes
Questions of clarification:	
<ul> <li>Could you give me an example?</li> <li>Is your basic pointor?</li> <li>How does relate to?</li> <li>Could you explain that further?</li> <li>Why do you say that?</li> </ul>	
Questions that probe	
assumptions:

<ul> <li>Questions about viewpoints or perspectives:</li> <li>How would other groups or types of people respond? Why? What would influence them?</li> <li>How would people who disagree with this viewpoint argue their case?</li> <li>Did anyone see this another</li> </ul>	

<ul> <li>way?</li> <li>What is an alternative?</li> <li>What would be another way of saying that?</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Questions that probe</li> <li>implications and consequences:</li> <li>What effect would that have?</li> <li>If this and this are the case, then what else must also be true?</li> <li>What are you implying by that?</li> <li>How do you know you've considered the consequences?</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Questions about the question:</li> <li>To answer this question, what questions would we have to answer first?</li> <li>Is this the same issue as?</li> <li>How is that question going to help you? Can you think of any other questions that might be useful?</li> <li>Is this question easy or hard to answer? Why?</li> </ul>
