

The **Intel® Teach Leadership Forum** provides face-to-face professional development focusing on the importance of leadership in promoting, supporting, and modeling the use of technology in instruction. Through the forum, participants explore relevant research and behaviors related to supporting effective technology integration and associated professional development.

All forum materials are provided free of charge and include a CD containing relevant research, case studies, and other resources to help leaders implement their action plans.

Goals

In this 4-hour forum, participants engage with their peers to:

- Examine the critical role leaders play in the effective integration of technology into teaching and learning
- Apply their knowledge to create a prioritized list of leadership behaviors that impact the integration of technology as a tool to improve student learning
- Analyze the International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) National Educational Technology Standards for Administrators (NETS-A)
- Synthesize their understanding to begin development of a personalized action plan to implement in their school or district

Research findings

Evaluation from U.S. participants include:

- Most participants said the ideas and skills they learned from the forum would help them improve teacher effectiveness and student achievement by supporting and promoting the integration of technology.
- A large majority said the "likelihood of forum ideas and skills improving teacher effectiveness and student achievement by supporting technology" was yes.
