Dear Judge Poppiti:

We understand from the translation service that you have now received 50 translated documents from the total number of documents that Fujitsu provided for *in camera* inspection. In addition, we understand that the translation service has sent the documents in that collection that were originally written in English and those that consist of images that cannot be translated. Although initially over 200 documents were selected for translation, AMD respectfully requests that Your Honor rule on AMD's motion to compel on the basis of the smaller sample of documents in English that are now available. The translation process is both slow and exceedingly expensive. AMD intends to take a document authentication deposition of Fujitsu before the discovery cut-off, and a ruling now on its motion will help assure that AMD has available all potential documents for use in that deposition on a timely basis.
